Solar Lighting Initiative

The Successful implementation of the solar lighting initiative aimed at enhancing the socio-economic conditions of unorganized workers. The initiative was a collaborative effort between The Department of Social Work at The Oxford College of Arts, Nevil Foundation, Tumkur and Selco Foundation Bangalore



The primary objective of the project was to provide solar lighting solutions to cobblers, street vendors, bakery, and tea shop individuals, thereby improving their socio-economic conditions by extending their working hours into the evening.

Integrating SDGs into initiatives like solar light installations for unorganized workers helps in addressing multiple development challenges while fostering inclusive and sustainable growth in society.



On May 2nd, 2024, the initiative culminated in the successful installation of solar lighting systems benefiting seven individuals, including cobblers and a tea shop owner, out of eight identified beneficiaries.

The Installation for first batch was possible in Jayanagar, Koramangala , Doddaballapura , HSR Layout & Hosa Road .




Government Higher Primary School, Rayasandra.
