





It also gave them an insight to the various career opportunities in patent law, regulatory affairs, and drug development. It gave the students some idea about how to conduct patent searches to ensure that new drug compounds or formulations do not infringe on existing patents and some understanding the structure and components of patents.










The content of the session

The right to health is provided for in Article 25 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights of December 10, 1948 (the UDHR). That Article provides that "Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and of his family, including food, clothing, housing and medical care and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control." As we see, the State cannot guarantee an individual's right to health in the same way as the other rights could be implemented, such as the right to freedom for instance; health is therefore a product of the combined action of a series of variables, some of which are beyond human control.

The Patent System, before dealing with the patent system, it seems appropriate to speak briefly of intellectual property in general. Intellectual property is the generic term used to designate the subjective







rights that the various legal orders grant to the creators of immaterial assets of intellectual origin. Those immaterial assets may be of two kinds, namely either literary and artistic creations or distinctive signs and inventions. Intellectual property therefore establishes the protection of ideas and designs in art and technology, in industry and in trade.

Patents for Pharmaceutical Products Obviously, as technical and industrial needs and economic organization have evolved, patent law has itself evolved in recent years. In Europe above all, where it originated, the relevant provisions went on from being a vehicle for promoting the development of local industry and became a factor of the internationalizing.

phenomenon that has made it possible for the owners of patents to work them at the international level. It is thus worth noting that patent law has evolved and continues to evolve in line with the economic and technical-industrial necessities of the country in which it operates. This moreover explains the concept of industrial property in general being an instrument of development, a tool which, depending on the shape given it, is capable of influencing the economic and ultimately the social development of the country in which it is applied.

The content delivered in the seminar is as follows:

Dr Priyadharshini.M, organizing Secretary inaugrated guests and participants to the seminar. The seminar was commenced with emphasis on basic understanding about sampling design in research ,where sample design is a definite plan for obtaining a sample from the sampling frame. It refers to the technique or the procedure the researcher uses for a sample from the sampling units from which inferences about the population is drawn. Sampling design is determined before any data are collected. The speaker emphasized on different steps involved in developing sample design in a research study, characteristics of good sample design. The speaker addressed different types of sample design such as ,Random Sampling: It involves selecting individuals randomly from the population, using techniques such as lottery or random number generation. This method ensures that every individual has an equal chance of being selected. Stratified Sampling: This involves dividing the population into subgroups

(strata) based on relevant characteristics, such as age or gender. Then, a sample is selected from each subgroup using random sampling techniques. Cluster Sampling: This involves selecting a subset of groups or clusters from the population, then selecting individuals from those groups. Multi-Stage Sampling: This involves combining different sampling techniques to select the sample, such as using stratified sampling followed by random sampling. Probability Sampling: This involves using random selection methods to select the sample, ensuring that every individual has a known probability of being selected. Non-Probability Sampling: This involves using non-random methods to select the sample, such as convenience or purposive sampling.

The need for sampling is very important aspect of randomization in research study. 1. sampling can save time and money. A sample study is usually less expensive and produces results at a relatively faster speed, enable more accurate measurements for a sample study is generally conducted by trained and experienced investigators. Sampling remains the only way when population contains infinitely many members, remains the only choice when a test involves the destruction of the item under study. It enables to estimate the sampling errors and, thus, assists in obtaining information concerning some characteristic of the population.

The speaker further stated about sampling errors. Sample surveys do imply the study of a small portion of the population and as such there would naturally be a certain amount of inaccuracy in the information collected. This inaccuracy may be termed as sampling error or error variance..

Hence, finally speaker concluded that effective sampling techniques is important for achieving successful research study with accurate results. At times, several methods of sampling is used for same study for getting appropriate outcome in research.







The lecture explored various aspects of conducting a literature survey, including the different sources of information available, from academic journals to online databases. Dr. Babu emphasized the importance


