They can provide information on disease prevention, healthy lifestyle practices, and proper medication usage. Pharmacists can offer personalized counseling to patients, ensuring that they understand their prescriptions, potential side effects, and proper administration. Community pharmacies can conduct


CONTENT

PREAMBLE

The National Testing Agency (NTA) conducts the Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) exam for admission to M Pharm or equivalent courses. GPAT scores are accepted by 800 participating institutes and all the All-India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) approved institutions and universities. The exam was conducted by AICTE up to 2017, currently PCI is conducting the exam.

GPAT will be conducted by NTA as three-hour entrance examination in Computer Based Test (CBT) mode to evaluate the candidate's ability across various segments, for admission to the Masters (M. Pharm) Program in the academic session. The participating institutions of GPAT are the Institutions which will be accepting the Score of GPAT.

Candidates must apply separately to the desired GPAT-2024 participating Institutions with the GPAT score. 



PREAMBLE

National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education Research (NIPER) are the group of national level Institution of Pharmaceutical Sciences in India. The Government of India has declared the NIPERs as Institution of national importance. They operate as autonomous bodies under the aegis of department of pharmaceuticals, Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers.

The NIPER JEE exam is conducted in an online (computer-based) mode. The exam duration is usually 2 hours (120 minutes). The exam contains a total of 200 questions. All the questions in NIPER JEE are multiple-choice questions (MCQs) with four options, out of which candidates must choose the correct answer. Each correct answer carries 1 mark, and there is a negative marking of 0.25 marks for each wrong answer.

Candidates must apply separately to the desired NIPER participating Institutions with the NIPER score. Thereafter, each participating Institute will release their respective cut off NIPER Scores which a candidate should meet to get qualified for admission to that particular Institution. After the declaration of results, qualified candidates are called for counselling. During counselling, candidates can select their preferred NIPER institute and course based on their rank, category, and availability of seats. Required documents are verified during this process. As per government rules, reservations are usually provided for candidates belonging to reserved categories such as SC/ST/OBC/PH. Relaxation in educational qualifications and/or percentage may be applicable. Specific details can be found in the official notification.
