




Fig1: Guest Lecture by Dr Anuradha pai, Professor, The Oxford Dental College, Bangalore.








Fig2. Pot painted by Ms Rakshitha from III Pharm D (first left), Ms. Soniya Kumari from I D. Pharm (centre) and by Ms Varra Jhansi from I D. Pharm (right) for the pot-paining-plantation competition.




Fig 3: Students during the World Environment Day awareness NSS program.





To build on this success, future programs could focus on sustained educational campaigns, increased partnerships with healthcare institutions, and continued advocacy for improved policies and resources for cancer prevention and treatment.



PREAMBLE

The Oxford College of Pharmacy, under NSS committee celebrated "World Oral Health Day" on 22nd march 2024 at 10.30 am. There were 100 participants in the program. The Oral Health is the condition of the mouth, teeth and orofacial structures that enable individuals to perform essential functions such as speaking, breathing and eating. Various modifiable risk factors, such as food consumption rich in sugar, poor oral hygiene, tobacco and alcohol use, lead to oral disorders. Pregnant women's gums are more prone to plaque due to hormonal shifts.

Among the various oral diseases, dental caries (tooth decay) is the most common. In addition, other oral diseases include and are not limited to the following.

- Dental cancer (uncontrollable cell growth in the buccal cavity)
- Tooth loss (unnatural falling of teeth)
- Oro- dental trauma (Pain due to injury in the teeth, mouth and oral cavity)
- Periodontal disease (Infection and inflammation of the gum tissues)

Background

World Oral Health Day was first celebrated September 12, 2007, on the birthday of FDI founder Dr Charles Godon. It was organised by the FDI World Dental Federation to raise global awareness around importance of oral health and hygiene. However, in 2013, the FDI decided to move the date to March 20 in order to avoid conflict with other events and to align with the international calendar. For the past decade, the day is being celebrated on March 20 to promote oral health education, prevention, and advocacy worldwide.

OBJECTIVES OF THE ACTIVITY

- The objective of celebrating World Oral Health Day is to Adopt health-promoting behaviours— use of fluoride toothpaste, brush at least twice daily, decrease sugar intake, prophylaxis, and visit dental clinic twice yearly. Provide Curative Treatment of Caries – ART, Amalgam and Composite fillings, etc.
- Students will be able to interpret and apply nutrition concepts to evaluate and improve the
 nutritional health of communities. Students will be able to integrate knowledge and skills
 in food and nutrition with professional issues affecting the nutrition and/or dietetics fields.



PREAMBLE

PREAMBLE:

The World Health Organization in 1987 adopted the resolution for the creation of a global observance day dedicated to the control of tobacco use. The first World No Tobacco Day was observed on May 31, 1988. The theme of the inaugural year was, "Tobacco or Health: Choose Health. World Anti-tobacco Day 2024 will give a platform to young people across the world, who are urging governments to shield them from predatory tobacco marketing tactics. The industry targets youth for a lifetime of profits, creating a new wave of addiction. Children are using e-cigarettes at rates higher than adults in all regions and globally an estimated 37 million youth aged 13–15 years use tobacco.

The content of the session

The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bengaluru, under NSS committee organized "World Antitobacco Day 2024" on May 31st 2024 with an aim to educate our staffs and students about the awareness of alternative crop production and marketing opportunities for tobacco farmers. - * Effective communication is also crucial in managing public expectations.
- Governments must convey that tax hikes are not one-off events but part of a sustained effort to keep tobacco prices increasing to motivate current smokers to quit and deter young people from starting.
- Simplifying tax rates and basing them on quantity rather than price can prevent tobacco users from switching to cheaper brands. Additionally, "soft earmarking" of tax revenues—linking increased taxes to increased health spending—can garner grassroots support for tax hikes.
- * Regional collaboration can also enhance the impact of these measures, as seen in the European Union, by minimizing cross-border smuggling and fostering shared goals among countries.

The students actively participated in various disciplines, including Pharm.D and M.Pharm.



Around 1.4 million people die annually and 74 million will have their lives shortened by diseases related to poor water, sanitation and hygiene. However, there are various factors that need to be taken into consideration which is being emphasized on World Water Day-2024 were also briefed by the speaker such as

- > Take shorter showers and don't let the tap run when brushing my teeth, doing dishes and preparing food.
- > Share water fetching between women and men, girls and boys.

PREAMBLE

Antibiotics are essential medicines that fight infections caused by bacteria in humans and animals by either killing the bacteria or making it difficult for them to grow and multiply. However, their misuse and unnecessary prescription can lead to side effects and contribute to antibiotic resistance, which is a significant threat to public health.

CONTENT

An awareness program was held on 8/05/2023 at The Oxford College of Pharmacy, organised by Ms. Nagalakshmi, dept of pharmacology and speech delivered by Dr. Noopur Srivastava, HOD Pharmacology, discussed in depth about awareness on antibiotic usage and explained thoroughly regarding antibiotic resistance and its effects. There were 50 Participants.

Antibiotics are potent drugs that cure certain illnesses and, when taken correctly, may save lives. They either prevent germs from multiplying or kill them. Bacteria are normally killed by the immune system before they grow and produce symptoms. White blood cells (WBCs) destroy dangerous germs; even if symptoms appear, the immune system is normally able to manage and fight off the illness. However, there are occasions when the quantity of hazardous germs is enormous, and the immune system is unable to eliminate them all. Antibiotics can in handy in this situation.

Penicillin was the first antibiotic. Penicillin-based medicines, such as ampicillin, amoxicillin, and penicillin G, are still accessible and have been used for many years to treat a range of illnesses.

As well as they discussed about the side effects of antibiotic usage. The amount of antibiotics to which our planet's microbes have been exposed over the previous half-century might be in the millions of metric tons. Antibiotic overuse has resulted in selection pressure and the evolution of multidrug resistant superbugs. In India, the situation is considerably worse because antibiotics may be acquired over the counter and, more recently, through internet shopping without a legitimate doctor's prescription.

You may need to take antibiotics for some bacterial infections. For example, you might not need them for many sinus infections. Taking antibiotics when they're not needed won't help you, and they can have side effects.






Also overuse or misuse of antibiotics can lead to antibiotic-resistance and side effects. Therefore, it is crucial to use antibiotics rationally to maximize their benefits and prevent risks. From this program the students were educated about the importance of antibiotics in treating infectious diseases provided they use it properly under the observation of doctor with prescription. If the same medicine misused, the patients may get resistance to the antibiotic and may lead to further complications to the patients. Thereafter, college has taken initiative to send students and faculty in the local community to spread awareness of the same. The students visited voluntarily to some of the pharmacies to educate and sensitize pharmacist and people working in the pharmacy shop, not to dispense antibiotics without prescription and half dosage regimen. From this discussion the pharmacists expressed their happiness for students concern towards people and society. The community pharmacists assured students that they don't dispense antibiotics without proper prescription and incomplete regimen. Additionally, the students learned the scientific management of inventories, documentation practices to be adopted in line with rational use of antibiotics as per Drugs Control Department. There were around 50 participants in this program.
